People Protecting Poquito Bayou update – Dave Hensley

Last month we told you that the owners of the property have contracted with an environmental firm to conduct testing on the property to satisfy the screening assessment concerns. We have been told by FEDP that testing is complete, and they have coordinated the test results with the EPA. We will share the test results when we receive a formal announcement from FDEP/EPA. Once the coordination is complete, the results will be made public. We see three possible scenarios:

1. Additional testing is required to satisfy the concerns stipulated in the April 2024 screening assessment report.
2. They find contamination. A cleanup process will take place to remediate the contaminated soil. This will result in the eventual approval of the development order for 139 cookie cutter homes built by D.R. Horton.
3. No contamination is found. This will result in the eventual approval of the development order for 139 cookie cutter homes built by D.R. Horton. To be prepared, we're currently reviewing our rebuttal to the development order.

We need help with any concerned citizens who have unique skill sets with the environment, engineering and traffic who can help not only us to finalize our development rebuttal.

Meeting called to order at 18:00 (by Sean Cramer)

Present: Sean Cramer, Whitney Cramer, Bob Davis, Felicia Murphy, David Boyd, Pat Hollarn, Tricia Flaherty, Pam Martin, Mary Ann Leone, Michael Aid, and Tammy Aid.

Minutes of the August meeting had been distributed; motion to approve was made by Michael and seconded by Mary Ann, minutes were approved.

Old Business: For the Veteran's Memorial, Ken Leone is working on the current poles, and Mary Ann, Felicia, and Pam are working to acquire new poles for expansion, up to twenty in the next couple of years. The Bylaws committee presented its proposal for changes that will include changes to the Board, deleting positions that have not been filled, and adding the Membership Director. It will also clarify regular and associate memberships based on residence within the set boundaries. Board members will be required to pay dues by 31 January (versus 01 January), and the requirement for two signatures per check will be lifted. Sean and Pam will form the financial review committee. The Abandoned Homes Committee had no report.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report for August was presented by Tricia. Income for August was \$18.81, and expenses were \$156.51. Total funds are \$9,751.05 and available funds (not obligated) for budgeted items are \$6,703.49. The report was unanimously approved after a motion by Mike and second by Felicia.

Membership: Pam reported 125 paid members.

BHEV: Candidate night was held 08 August at BHEV, and Bob thanked BHEV for their support. It was agreed that those who participated did an excellent job. It was recommended that as many as possible take part in the CMSAF Binnicker run on 05 October.

Poquito Boat Ramp Park: No current issues reported. Members are encouraged to call if a problem is identified, such as the cut wire for the maritime monitoring station, identified by Dave Hensley.

Street & Traffic Safety: There was no update.

Street Directors: There was no update.

Park Update: Concrete benches have been damaged, and the heavy concrete pieces will require removal. Some of the board members will meet this weekend to place them in a position to be hauled off by the county. A camera may be required to identify the sources of the damage.

Events: The General Membership meeting will be held Saturday, 26 October at 1600 in Leo Norred Park, with light refreshments, just before Trunk or Treat. The Veterans Day Ceremony will be held on 11 November at Leo Norred Park. A speaker invited this week, and Ken, Michael, Tricia, and Sean will help plan the ceremony. Pam will work to organize a Quilt of Valor ceremony as has been done the past two years. The semiannual Garage Sale will be held 09-10 November. Friendsgiving will be held TBD (presumably 16 or 23 November).

Announcements: Newsletter articles for next newsletter due to Bob Davis by the end of the week. Next PBCA board meeting scheduled 1800 on Monday, October 7th at Martin home, 17 Magnolia.

The meeting adjourned at 18:56 pm.

IF A BEAR IS...

- Far away
- Easily scared away
- In a tree/standing up/passing through
- Leaving scat, tracks or scratch marks on trees
- Feeding on natural foods (acorns, berries, insects)

Enjoy from a safe distance and never approach a bear.



IF A BEAR IS...

- Not scared away by loud noises
- Eating food/garbage/pet food/birdseed when people are not present
- Protecting food or cubs (charges, blocks food or cubs from people)

Find a safe place, call the FWC Wildlife Alert Hotline to report the behavior.



IF A BEAR IS...

- Approaching people or pets
- Linger near human use areas
- Entering a tent, building or vehicle
- Physically making contact with a person
- Eating food/garbage/pet food/birdseed when people are present

Find a safe place, call the FWC Wildlife Alert Hotline and the manager should consider closing the area.

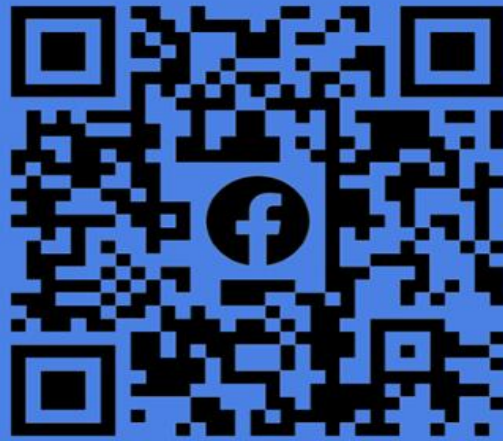

Quilt of Valor (QOV) Ceremony

Last year we had a Quilt of Valor ceremony for a handful of Veterans during our annual Veterans Day ceremony. It was an awesome ceremony. Some of the veterans who received a quilt had tears in their eyes. For this upcoming Veterans' Day Ceremony on November 11th at 4pm near the monument, we will host another QOV ceremony. We need Veterans, to either nominate themselves or have loved ones or friends to nominate a Veteran.

You're probably wondering what is a Quilt of Valor?

A Quilt of Valor (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation."

How do I get a QOV or get one for a family member? You nominate a Service Member or Living Veteran. Awarding a Service Member or Living Veteran a Quilt of Valor Foundation is a shared responsibility of the nominator and the QOVF Volunteer. Our QOVF volunteer is Pam Martin.

What's "touched by war"?

These examples are meant to help you better understand the phrase "touched by war."

- Engaging in direct combat, no matter when or where, in declared or undeclared wars or conflicts
- Being wounded or injured in training for combat or direct support of combat
- Serving while in harm's way delivering support, supplies, etc., to those engaged in preventing conflicts or engaged in battle or combat
- Caring for the casualties, injured, and ill service members or veterans on the frontlines, in-theater, deployed, or in hospitals and medical centers overseas or stateside
- Providing casualty assistance to families of the fallen, escorting the fallen or remains, and/or participating in honor guards
- Being there to listen, to minister, and to support others struggling with the demons of being in a war zone
- Supporting at home for those down range can be nominated. Please do not feel your contribution to any conflict is minimal. If you have served in time of war or conflict you made a sacrifice.

And more....

Who is eligible for a QOV?

Any service member or living veteran who served in one of the following branches: Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard. Members of the activated National Guard and activated or active duty-special work (ADSW) reservists are included. The Army National Guard and Air Force National Guard are components of the Army and Air Force respectively. Merchant Marines were activated from 1941 to 1945. Additionally, anyone who serves at the Dover Mortuary Facility is eligible.

- Served during declared war, conflicts, police actions, peacekeeping missions, and counter terrorism operations and/or times of peace.
- Service during, but not necessarily limited to; WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Panama, Beirut, Granada, Bosnia, the Cold War, Desert Storm, Desert Shield, Iraq, Afghanistan, anti-terrorism operations, and terrorism attacks against Armed Forces personnel is included.
- Only veterans with an Honorable or General Discharge status are eligible.
- Note: QOVF does not award QOVs posthumously. The individual must be living.
